How Deep Does Subjectivity Go?

According to Subjective Physicalism, the world is completely made of physical stuff, but certain parts of the world can only be fully understood by subjects who instantiate certain physical states.

One challenge for this approach to the mind/body problem is that subjective physicalism might collapse into a form of panpsychism, according to which consciousness is everywhere, even in sticks, stones and electrons.

Dr. Robert J. Howell is Dedman Family Distinguished Professor of Philosophy at Southern Methodist University. He works on topics in metaphysics, epistemology, and philosophy of mind, especially concerning the nature of subjectivity and the self. Professor Howell is the author of Consciousness and the Limits of Objectivity (OUP, 2013), The God Dialogues, with Torin Alter (OUP, 2011), and A Dialogue on Consciousness, with Torin Alter (OUP, 2009), among other publications.
